Thanks to the ongoing support of our members, our co-operative has played a significant role in advancing the renewable energy economy and reducing greenhouse gases in Saskatchewan.

Since our incorporation in 2015 as the first renewable energy co-operative in the province, we have collectively facilitated the construction of seven projects and we now have an eighth project underway. In this latest project we have partnered with Case New Holland Industrial for a second time to expand our installation at their location.

Our 200+ members now collectively own solar installations with a total of 1588 solar panels generating 583 kilowatts of energy at peak capacity. This will be significantly increased with this new installation.

SES Solar Co-op owns and operates solar energy installations that any Saskatchewan resident can invest in. We have the greatest solar resource in the country, providing us with a world-class opportunity to build resilience into our energy infrastructure for ourselves and future generations. By pooling our individual resources to invest in solar projects, we can create a sustainable energy source, offset greenhouse gas emissions from fossil fuel generated electricity, and provide a return on investment – all at the same time. Win, win, win!
